Wed, Jan 1, 1919

In accordance with 7th Canadian Infantry Brigade Operation Order No. 191/3, attached as Appendix “1”, the 7th Canadian Infantry Brigade Group marched from the NEDERBRAKEL Area to the RENAIX Area. At the conclusion of the move Brigade Headquarters opened in RENAIX. The Units were disposed as follows: R.C.R., RENAIX. P.P.C.L.I., RENAIX. 42nd Battalion, RENAIX. 49th Battalion, RENAIX. 3rd Battalion, C.M.G., FLOBECQ-KILLEZELLES Area. 10th Cdn. Field Ambulance, RENAIX. No.2 Coy., 3rd Cdn. Divn'l Train, RENAIX.

Thu, Jan 2, 1919

In accordance with 7th Canadian Infantry Brigade Operation Order No. 191/4, attached as Appendix “2”, the 7th Canadian Infantry Brigade Group moved from RENAUX Area to the CELLES Area. Brigade Headquarters was established in CELLES. The Units were disposed as follows: R.C.R., VELAINES. P.P.C.L.I., CELLES. 42nd Battalion, HERINNES. 49th Battalion, MOURCOURT. 3rd Battalion, C.M.G.C., WATTRIPONT-ANSEROEUL Area. 10th Cdn. Field Ambulance, MOLEMBAIX. No. 2 Coy., 3rd Cdn. Divn'l Train, MOLEMBAIX. Brigadier-General J. A. CLARK, D.S.O., (bar) left on a visit to Germany, and Lieutenant-Colonel R. H. PALMER, D.S.O., assumed command of the Brigade.

Fri, Jan 3, 1919

In accordance with 7th Canadian Infantry Brigade Operation Order No. 191/5, attached as Appendix “3”, the 7th Canadian Infantry Brigade Group marched from the CELLES Area to the ESTAIMBOURG Area. Brigade Headquarters opened at 45 Rue de La Gare, ESTAIMBOURG, and the disposition of the Units was as follows: R.C.R., ESTAIMBOURG. P.P.C.L.I., ST. LEGER. 42nd Battalion, NECHINN. 49th Battalion, NECHIN. 3rd Battalion, C.M.G.C., PECQ-BAILLEUL Area. 10th Cdn. Field Ambulance,

TRIEU DE MONBRAY. No.2 Coy., 3rd Cdn. Divn'l Train, NECHIN. Captain E. Osborne, M.C. proceeded to 3rd Canadian Division Headquarters as D.A.Q.M.G. Captain W. J. WILBY, M.C., assumed the duties of Brigade Major.

Sat, Jan 4, 1919

The Units spent the day settling in billets. Brigadier-General J. A. CLARK, D.S.O., (bar) returned from Germany in the evening. Lieut-Colonel R. H. PALMER, D.S.O., left on a visit to Germany.

Sun, Jan 5, 1919

Training, sports, and education were recommenced in the Units. Brigadier-General J. A. CLARK, D.S.O., (bar) left for England, on leave and Lieut-Colonel A. Hamilton Gault, D.S.O., assumed command of the Brigade during Lieut-Colonel PALMER'S absence.

Mon, Jan 6, 1919

The Units carried on with training, sports and education.

Tue, Jan 7, 1919

The Units held training, classes and games.

Wed, Jan 8, 1919

Training, sports and classes as usual. A conference of the Education Officers of the Division was held at the 42nd Battalion Headquarters, NECHIN at 15.00 hours.

Thu, Jan 9, 1919

The 42nd and 49th Battalions started the Medical Examinations necessary prior to demobilization. The remainder of the Units carried on with training.

Fri, Jan 10, 1919

The 42nd and 49th Battalions proceeded with the Medical Examinations. Those of the 49th Battalion not undergoing Medical Examination went to TEMPLEUVE for baths. Owing to Medical Board and baths no educational classes were held.

Sat, Jan 11, 1919

Battalions carried out route marches. 42nd Battalion went for baths in TEMPLEUVE. Lieut-Colonel R. H. PALMER, D.S.O., returned from Germany and took over command of the Brigade.

Sun, Jan 12, 1919

Church parades were held by Units. There was a Medical Inspection of personnel of Brigade Headquarters at R.C.R. Headquarters.

Mon, Jan 13, 1919

Usual training carried out by Battalions during the morning and sports during the afternoon. Prebendary GOUGH, LONDON University, gave a lecture on "Democracy" to Units in Concert Hall.NECHIN. at 14:30 hours.

Tue, Jan 14, 1919

Usual training carried out by Battalions during the morning and sports during the afternoon.

Wed, Jan 15, 1919

Battalions carried out training during the morning and sports during the afternoon. At 14:30 hours representatives of the Soldiers' Settlement Board met the G.O.C., and all Battalion Commanders, at Brigade Headquarters, to discuss points reference Soldiers' Settlement.

Thu, Jan 16, 1919

Training carried out by Battalions during the morning and sports during the afternoon. At 9.30 hours a conference reference demobilization was held at 9th Canadian Infantry Brigade Headquarters, TEMPLEUVE, by the Divisional Commander, and attended by all Officers of the Division.

Fri, Jan 17, 1919

The Brigade was inspected at 11.30 hours by Lieutenant-General Sir Arthur W. CURRIE, K.C.B., K.C.M.G., General CURRIE addressed the Officers and Other ranks of the Brigade, giving an outline of proposed demobilization scheme. Sports was carried out by Battalions in the afternoon.

Sat, Jan 18, 1919

Training carried out by Battalions during the morning. Sports held during the afternoon. At 10.15 hours Dr. DALE of MCGILL University gave a lecture to the R.C.R. on "Education as an Investment", which was attended by 450 all ranks. Lieut-Colonel R. H. PALMER, D.S.O. and Officer Commanding R.C.R. were present. At 14.00 hours Dr. DALE gave a lecture on "Education as an Investment" to Officers and men of other Units. 450 all ranks were present. Both lectures were very much appreciated by all ranks present.

Sun, Jan 19, 1919

Church parades were held by all Battalions. Brigadier-General J. A. CLARK, D.S.O., (bar) returned from leave and took over command of the Brigade.

Mon, Jan 20, 1919

Battalions carried out usual syllabus of training. At 11:00 hours Captain McKINNON of the Khaki University lectured P.P.C.L.I. on "Safe Guards of Civilization", dealing with the French and Russian revolutions.

Tue, Jan 21, 1919

Battalions carried on with training. At 11:00 hours Captain McKINNON lectured 42nd and 49th Battalions at Concert Hall NECHIN, on "Safe Guards of Civilization", and at 14:00 hours he lectured the R.C.R. on the same subject at Concert Hall NECHIN.

Wed, Jan 22, 1919

Battalions carried out usual training during the morning; and sports during the afternoon.

Thu, Jan 23 & Fri, Jan 24 & Sat, Jan 25, 1919

Battalions carried out usual syllabus of training during the morning and sports during the afternoon.

Sun, Jan 26, 1919

Battalions held church parades.

Mon, Jan 27, 1919

Battalions carried out usual training during the morning and sports during the afternoon. At 11.00 hours there was a conference of Battalion Commanders at Brigade Headquarters to discuss demobilization scheme.

Tue, Jan 28, 1919

Battalions carried out usual syllabus of training and sports. Dr. DALE of McGill University gave a lecture on "Education as an Investment" to P.P.C.L.I. at 10.00 hours. Major-General F.O.W. LOOMIS, C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., and Brigadier-General J. A. CLARK, D.S.O., (bar) attended, Consecration of Colours. at P.P.C.L.I. at 14.45 hours.

Wed, Jan 29, 1919

Battalions carried on training and sports.

Thu, Jan 30, 1919

Battalions carried out training and sports. Brigadier-General J. A. CLARK, D.S.O., (bar), Lieut-Colonel MacLEOD, D.S.O., Capt. W. J. WILBY, M.C., and Lieut. D. McGillivray visited MONS.

Fri, Jan 31, 1919

Usual training and sports carried out by Battalions.

Sat, Feb 1, 1919

The disposition of the Units of the Brigade was as follows: R.C.R., ESTAIMBOURG. P.P.C.L.I., ST. LEGER. 42nd Battalion, NECHIN. 49th Battalion, NECHIN. Brigade Headquarters, ESTAIMBOURG. Entrainment for Base commenced. The R.C.R. and 4 companies of the P.P.C.L.I. entrained at BAISEUX, FRANCE at 11.00 hours.

Sun, Feb 2, 1919

Preparation completed for entrainment of remainder of 7th Canadian Infantry Brigade.

Mon, Feb 3, 1919

R.C.R., and 4 companies of P.P.C.L.I., detrained at LE HAVRE at 02.45 hours. Remainder of Brigade entrained at BAISEUX at 11.00 hours.

Tue, Feb 4, 1919

The Brigade less the R.C.R., and 4 companies of P.P.C.L.I. en route for LE HAVRE. R.C.R. and 4 companies of P.P.C.L.I. carried on with preparations for embarkation. Men were bathed and medically examined.

Wed, Feb 5, 1919

Brigade less R.C.R. and 4 companies of P.P.C.L.I., arrived at LE HAVRE about 18.00 hours. R.C.R. sailed from LE HAVRE at midnight 5/6th.

Thu, Feb 6, 1919

R.C.R. disembarked at WEYMOUTH at 08.00 hours. Remained in WEYMOUTH. night of 6/7th. Remainder of Brigade carried on with preparations for embarkation at Canadian Embarkation Camp, LE HAVRE. Men were bathed and medically examined.

Fri, Feb 7, 1919

Brigade Headquarters and P.P.C.L.I., and 42nd Battalion embarked at 17.00 hours. R.C.R. arrived at BRAMSHOTT Camp.

Sat, Feb 8, 1919

The 49th Battalion sailed for England. Brigade Headquarters P.P.C.L.I., and 42nd Battalion arrived at BRAMSHOTT Camp.

Sun, Feb 9, 1919

49th Battalion arrived at BRAMSHOTT Camp.

Mon, Feb 10 to Fri, Feb 28, 1919

During this period the Brigade remained at BRAMSHOTT Camp. Documentation and Medical Examination of Officers and men was carried on with. Preparations for departure and entrainment at LIPHOOK Station of R.C.R. and 42nd Battalion was completed by midnight Feb. 28th/ Mch. 1st.

On the 21st H.R.H., The Princess PATRICIA accompanied by Prince ARTHUR of Connaught, Lady Evelyn FARQUHAR and Miss Dorothy YORK, inspected the P.P.C.L.I. Major-General F. O. W. LOOMIS, C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., Brigadier-General A. H. BELL, C.M.G., D.S.O., and Brigadier-General J. A. CLARK, D.S.O., (bar) were present. The Princess addressed the Battalion on their splendid war record and affixed a bronze laurel wreath to the Regimental Colour in recognition of their services. Lieut-Colonel A. Hamilton GAULT replied briefly and the Regiment gave three cheers for the Princess.

On the 25th Brigadier-General E. M. DYER, C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., and Mrs. DYER, Lieut. and Mrs. G. OGILVIE and Master William DYER visited the Brigade. Addressing them briefly General DYER thanked the Officers, N.C.O's and men of the Brigade for their faithful service under him in France. General DYER was heartily cheered by all ranks. After the Parade General DYER and party were entertained to luncheon at the Officers' Mess.

Feb. 26th H.M. The King invested a number of Officers of the 3rd Canadian Division at BUCKINGHAM PALACE. Brigadier-General J. A. CLARK, D.S.O., (bar) and other Officers of the Brigade received decorations at the hands of His Majesty.

Feb. 27th, Brigadier-General J. A. Clark, D.S.O., (bar) addressed the R.C.R., and 49th Battalion, thanking them for their service in France and bidding them Godspeed to CANADA. 7th Canadian Infantry Brigade Warning Order No. A.46, attached as Appendix "1", sent to R.C.R., 42nd Battalion and 49th Battalion.
